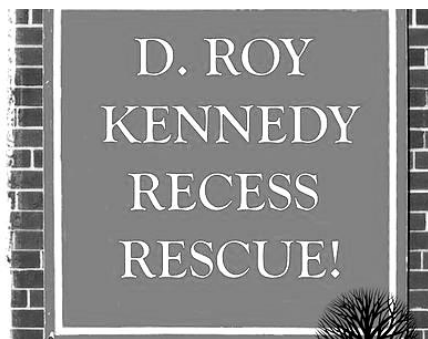

A message from our President

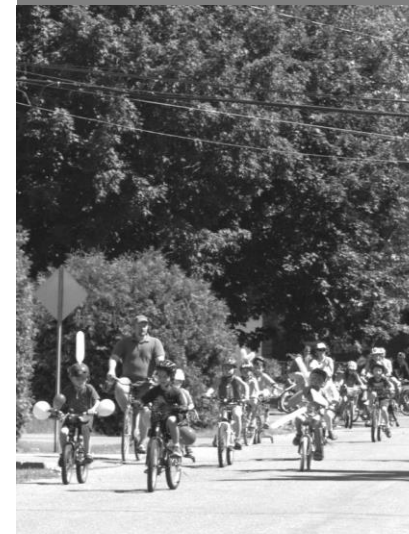
